Uwe and Krisztina Zimmermann started La Estancia Polo Club some four years ago, spearheading the return of polo to Hungary. Polo was originally introduced to the country by diplomat Count Lajos Széchényi de Sárvár-Felsővéd (1868-1919), who opened a club on Margarett Island in the Danube, in 1896. A second club was formed in 1901, with a ground in the middle of the city racetrack.

By 1936, it was possible for a Hungarian team to compete in what turned out to be the last time polo was an *Olympic sport*. They came fourth, behind Argentina, Great Britain and Mexico, having won one game against Germany, 16-6, and tying – again with the German squad – 8-8.

Now, thanks to the Zimmermanns, the galloping game has returned to the
